### **PET POLICY**

To keep pets and guests happy during their stay we've put together the following guidelines.

#### **Pet Friendly Areas**

- We welcome dogs to stay in the hotel between 1<sup>st</sup> November and 31<sup>st</sup> March.
- Your four – legged friend must be on a tight lead when in the hotel foyer and all public areas.
- We ask that you don't leave dogs unattended in bedrooms without letting the reception team know, we will provide you with a door sign to advise members of staff that the dog has been left in the room if you do leave without them. You will find this door sign on the back of your bedroom door.
- Owners are asked to take full responsibility for their pet's behaviour throughout their stay. If not, you may be charged for any damage/disturbance caused. We ask that they are well-behaved throughout your stay. Owners are asked to control any noise made by their dog to ensure it does not disturb other guests.
- If your pooch decides to have a lazy morning and stay in your bedroom, you can dine in the Wedgwood Suite for breakfast, or if they want to join you (if they've been good, they might get a sausage!) we would serve you breakfast in the Terrace.
- If you wish to dine with us of an evening, we will accommodate you and your pooch in our Terrace Lounge & Bar area, or if you decide to leave your well-behaved pooch to snooze in your room you can dine in our Terrace Restaurant.

#### **Housekeeping and Damage to Bedrooms/Public Areas**

- For the safety and comfort of your pet, Housekeeping will only enter your room if: your pet is not present, or if you are present with your pet (dog's must be on a lead).
- We kindly request that your dog does not sit on any furniture in public spaces or your bedroom.
- If you take your dog out for a walk, please ensure they are clean and dry before entering back into the hotel.
- Should your dog soil the room or any other area causing permanent damage or the necessity for additional cleaning services, or any other damage, you will be charged accordingly.
- We provide you with a dog blanket, feeding bowl and mat for use in the hotel, please leave in your room on departure. If you want to take them with you, you'll be charged accordingly. The welcome woof box is for you and your dog to enjoy.

### Dog Walking Routes

#### Recommended by Milo & his human Keeley from our Reservations Team

##### **Angel Bay – Penrhyn Bay LL30 3RW**

Angel Bay is a great dog friendly spot and one that you're both sure to love! Its important to note, depending on which parts you walk, you may come across some woolly sheep friends!

Walking level: Low, although there are some steps.

Time to walk: 15 minutes each way (but there is an opportunity to go off track and explore!)

Parking: Nearby roads

Key Highlight: Beautiful coastline views and wild seals on the beach.

#### Recommended by Missy & her human Jake from our Operational Team

##### **Bryn Euryn – Tan Y Bryn Road, Rhos On Sea LL28 4AB**

This place is a perfect off the lead walk for dogs! It's a nature reserve nestles away at the top of Rhos On Sea and is a great hillside (the word 'bryn' means 'hill' in English) walk with a mixture of grass and forests.

Walking Level: Good workout for humans and dogs. Medium (uphill)

Time to walk: 45 minutes to an hour to get to the top and back down again.

Parking: Small car park at the bottom is free of charge, however if there is no parking there is plenty of road parking near the entrance.

Key Highlight: Stunning views of the countryside and neighbouring towns. On a nice day it's the perfect place for a bit of a picnic!

### Times to enjoy the beach

- North Shore: You and your pooch can enjoy a walk along this beach (just on our doorstep) between October 1<sup>st</sup> and April 30<sup>th</sup>. However, from May – September, they are not allowed.
- West Shore: You and your pooch can enjoy a walk along this beach (20-minute leisurely stroll) between October 1<sup>st</sup> and April 30<sup>th</sup>. However, from May – September, they are not allowed.

### Doggy Bins

- Red bins are located along the promenade, where you can dispose of your 'doggy do' bags.
